Multiple opportunities are available:

- 1) **Teen Teacher's Aides** 19 or 34 service hours Training is provided in leadership skills and in accommodating the sensitivities and common learning difficulties and disabilities of intellectually gifted children. Throughout the term, there will be opportunities to develop leadership skills and confidence. Leadership skills include being proactive, planning, adaptability, communication, team building, assertiveness, and conflict management. This experience is a good fit for gifted students, students who are considering a career in teaching or who otherwise enjoy working with children, and those who love learning themselves.
