Multiple opportunities are available:

- 1) **Teen Teacher's Aides** 19 or 34 service hours Training is provided in leadership skills, classroom procedures, and accommodations for sensitivities and learning difficulties/disabilities common among intellectually gifted children. Throughout the term, there will be opportunities to develop leadership skills and confidence. This experience is a good fit for gifted students, students who are considering a career in teaching or who otherwise enjoy working with children, and those who love learning themselves. - 2) **Robotics Team Mentors** For teens who participated in *FIRST*[®] LEGO[®] League, Challenge level or VEX Robotics Competitions, middle school level. We offer enrichment classes fall, winter, and spring. Each term is six Saturdays long. Classes are fun, hands-on, cover a wide variety of subjects, and allow children to stretch their abilities in new areas. Just as important as the curricula, gifted children have a place to come together with more of their gifted peers. They may soar to their own heights, will meet others who share their intensity, ambitions, interests, and abilities, and can interact authentically. Many friendships have been made here.
